## September Speaker

### **Jay DeLancy, Executive Director of the N.C. Voter Integrity Project**



Jay DeLancy, Lt. Col. (Ret.), USAF, Executive Director of the Voter Integrity Project of North Carolina, is the speaker at the Moore Republican Women's September 10<sup>th</sup> luncheon.

Born and reared in Raleigh, DeLancy spent more than 22 years away from North Carolina while serving in the Army and Air Force. He started the Voter Integrity Project of North Carolina in February, 2011, with encouragement from the Texas-based True the Vote and California's Election Integrity Project.

His team of fired-up volunteers is currently working to remove the names of deceased NC residents from the voter rolls in all 100 counties. Earlier this summer, his group challenged the validity of more than 500 registered Wake County voters who convinced the Clerk of Courts that they were not US citizens in order to duck their jury duty. More than 100 of these individuals had voted before their jury disqualification, but Wake County District Attorney Colin Willoughby is not investigating the cases.

Jay's presentation will introduce people to the Voter Integrity Project of NC, highlight the types of activities they do, and show how to join efforts to stop vote fraud in November's election.

## Young Republicans Launch Voter Campaign

The North Carolina Federation of Young Professional Republicans has launched a "Boots on the Ground" campaign to turn North Carolina red. The group is deploying buses of over 50 volunteers each to five target areas in a door-to-door campaign to get out the vote.

Deployments will take place on the weekends of Sept. 15 and Oct. 19 in targeted districts in Wake County/Raleigh Metro area, New Hanover County/Wilmington Metro area; Buncombe County/Asheville Metro area, Cabarrus County/Charlotte-Mecklenberg Metro area and Guilford County/Greensboro Metro area. Over the three-day deployment, volunteers expect to knock on between 200,000 and 300,000 doors of "soft" Republicans who have not voted in recent elections.

In 2010, when the NC Federation of Young Republicans deployed volunteers to Wake County in a similar project, the precincts that were touched experienced a 20-22 percent increase in soft Republican voter turnout. Volunteers from Wake County, Washington, DC, and Northern Virginia are expected to participate.

## Lunch Cost to Increase in September

The cost of our lunch will increase from \$16 to \$17 beginning at the September meeting. The increase was implemented due to rising costs. The good news is the price is locked in for 18 months and will be in effect until Feb, 2014.

Joan Ward, who coordinates the lunch menu and reservations, has provided a few facts about the lunch reservations.

- The lunch coordinator selects the menu with assistance from the catering manager of Pinehurst Members Club.
- Reservations must be made by Wednesday afternoon prior to the meeting so a count can be given to Pinehurst. On Thursday morning, the chef places his orders to their suppliers
- Pinehurst builds in a 5% overage to our lunch count. We cannot order more lunches than the count because the MRW would be responsible to pay for them
- If more reservations are made after the count is given, Pinehurst Members Club may provide a substitute meal.
- A special lunch salad can be provided only for those individuals that have food allergies.
- You must cancel a reservation by the Saturday before the lunch or you will be responsible for payment of your lunch and/or your guest's lunch.
- The calling tree is a courtesy reminder.
