NC SENATOR JERRY TILLMAN - Senate Majority Whip and our District 29 Senator, Jerry Tillman, will brief us on legislation in NC. First elected in 2002, Senator Tillman is in his 7th Senate term and Co-Chairs the Finance and the Education/Higher Education committees. He is also a member of the Commerce, Appropriations, Program Evaluation, Workforce and Economic Development, and Judiciary I committees. Senator Tillman is a retired school administrator.



NC SENATOR BUCK NEWTON – Sen. Buck Newton announced that he is running for NC State Attorney General. Elected in 2010, the third-term Senator from District 11 serves Johnston, Nash, Wilson counties. Since graduating from Campbell University School of Law, Buck has practiced law at his firm in Wilson for the past sixteen years.

Newton chaired Judiciary Committees in the N.C. Senate since he was elected in 2010. Currently, Newton chairs the Judiciary I Committee, as well as the Appropriations Committee on Justice and Public Safety. In these roles, he is a key voice in setting policy and funding priorities for North Carolina's judiciary and law enforcement agencies.

President's Message Kay Wildt

Yes, shocking videos allegedly showing Planned Parenthood officials discussing the sale of aborted baby body parts were horrible. And it is true that the government helps to fund Planned Parenthood, yet, more than 25 percent of Planned Parenthood's \$1.3-billion annual revenue comes from private donations, including many corporate contributions.

IRAN NUCLEAR DEAL – BAD DEAL FOR U.S.

Opponents to the Iran Nuclear Deal are generally concerned that:

1. Iran will not keep its part of the bargain but will work on nuclear weapons in secret and clean up the evidence before the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) is allowed to inspect.
2. The U.S. will lift its sanctions and release billions of dollars in frozen assets to Iran and Iranian companies and individuals, including individuals known to be terrorists. Iran is a state sponsor of terrorism. Billions of dollars will flow to terror groups.
3. Iran cries “Death to Israel” and “Death to America.”
4. There are side deals whose details are unavailable.

After reading the Iran Nuclear Deal, my concerns also include:

1. Besides unfreezing of assets, sanctions are lifted on finance and banking, insurance, trade (especially oil and gas and related equipment, precious metals, industrial metals, software for industrial processes, aircraft and ships).
2. Participants to the deal commit to engage in joint projects with Iran, in the field of peaceful nuclear technology, including nuclear power plants, redesigning and rebuilding the Arak reactor into a modernized research reactor, fuel fabrication, establishment of a state-of-the-art regional nuclear medical centre, and personnel training.
3. “Implementation Day” is the day on which the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) verifies that Iran has implemented nuclear-related measures and, simultaneously, sanctions are lifted. After Implementation Day, if Iran believes that the sanctions are not being fully lifted, (or if another party believes that Iran was not meeting its commitments), there is a dispute resolution procedure.

Ultimately however, the complaining party could treat the unresolved issue as grounds to cease performing its commitments.

In summary, Iran could reap the benefits of Implementation Day’s unfreezing of assets and lifting of sanctions and subsequent assistance with nuclear power plants, medical centres and personnel training. Then Iran could complain that sanctions were not being fully lifted and cease performing its commitments. Even if the UN Security Council re-imposed the provisions of the old UN resolutions, the provisions would not apply with retroactive effect to contracts signed before the date of the dispute.

(UN)INTENDED CONSEQUENCE – ELEVATING THE PRESIDENCY

Annex V, Section B of the Deal states: “The United States, *acting pursuant to Presidential authorities*, will issue waivers, to take effect upon Implementation Day, ceasing the application of the *statutory* nuclear-related sanctions...”

Contact **Senator Burr** (202-224-3154), **Senator Tillis** (202-224-6342), and **Congresswoman Ellmers** (202-225-4531). Senator Burr has been the strongest opponent to the deal, but Senator Tillis and Congresswoman Ellmers have also expressed opposition.

Tell them that it is not enough to personally oppose the Deal, but that they must convince 2/3rds of their fellow Senators and Representatives to oppose the Deal also.

Margaret Sanger's Proposals Kay Wildt

Planned Parenthood, engulfed in a scandal following the release of two undercover videos, is the largest abortion provider in the United States.

On its website, the organization compliments Margaret Sanger as one of the pro-choice movement's "great heroes." Sanger started the American Birth Control League in 1921; it became part of the Planned Parenthood Federation of America in 1942.

Planned Parenthood praises Sanger for "providing contraception and other health services" and "advancing access to family planning in the United States and around the world."

Here are 13 things Sanger proposed during her lifetime.

- 1) Allow Congress to solve population problems by appointing a Parliament of Population to direct and control the population through birth rates and immigration, and direct its distribution over the country according to national needs consistent with taste, fitness and interest of the individuals**
- 2) Various methods of population control, including abortion, defend the unborn against their own disabilities.**
- 3) The United States should keep the doors of immigration closed to the entrance of certain aliens whose condition is known to be detrimental to the stamina of the race, such as feebleminded, idiots, morons, Insane, syphilitic, epileptic, criminal, professional prostitutes, and others in this class.**
- 4) A stern and rigid policy of sterilization and segregation of the population whose progeny is already tainted, or whose inheritance is such that objectionable traits may be transmitted to offspring."**
- 5) The unfit should be sent to farm lands and homesteads to be taught to work under competent instructors for the period of their entire lives.**
- 6) Selective births protect society against the propagation and increase of the unfit.**
- 7) Marriage licenses should provide couples with the right to only "a common household" but not parenthood. In fact, couples should have to obtain a permit to become parents of no more than one child.**
- 8) Large families were detrimental to society. "The most merciful thing that the large family does to one of its infant members is to kill it," she said.**
- 9) Motherhood must be efficient. Birth control is nothing more than the facilitation of the process of weeding out the unfit, of preventing the birth of defectives or of those who will become defectives.**
- 10) Population control: to develop a new race, physically fit, mentally capable, socially alert.**
- 11) An excess in population must be reduced.**
- 12) "We do not want word to go out that we want to exterminate the Negro population," Sanger wrote.**
- 13) In an interview with Mike Wallace, Sanger said, "I think the greatest sin in the world is bringing children into the world, that have disease from their parents, that have no chance in the world to be a human being practically."**
