THE JUNE 7th ELECTION IS CRITICAL – TURNOUT IS VITAL!

Important June 7th Special Primary Election Information - Two Races:

1. Judicial Race: The Primary on June 7th is critical because **NC Supreme Court Justice Bob Edmunds** faces three opponents in a contest to winnow the slate down from four to only two candidates whose names will be on the November 8th ballot. This means that Justice Edmunds must win on June 7th and again on November 8th in order for the North Carolina Supreme Court to keep a Conservative majority. If unsuccessful, the NC Supreme Court goes liberal and cannot be retaken until **2023**. Turnout is key for Justice Edmunds' seat, so encourage your family and friends to vote for only Bob Edmunds from amongst the judicial candidates.



Justice Bob Edmunds has been a member of the NC Supreme Court since 2000. Three challengers filed to run against him in the June 7th Primary, but only two names may advance to the ballot in November. MRW supports Justice Bob Edmunds, the only Republican; however, party affiliation will not be displayed on the ballot.

**Remember in the Judicial section of the ballot,
vote only for Robert (Bob) Edmunds!**

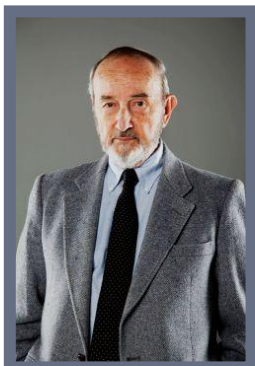

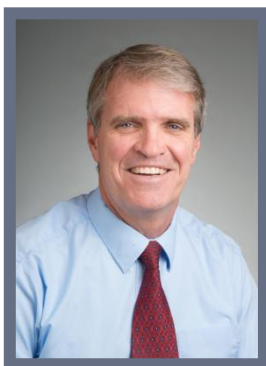

Ralph Jacobson – Holocaust Survivor



Remembering the 80th anniversary of the Holocaust, Ralph Jacobson, an outstanding member of the Moore County community, will share his personal experiences as a youth in Nazi Germany. Ralph watched as Hitler changed the form of government to totalitarianism. Suddenly his town changed to one in which state-sponsored murder and terror became the norm. Ralph was a prominent attorney for Sears, Roebuck & Co., in Chicago, when he and his wife, Vivian, decided to retire in 1990. Ralph and Vivian have contributed in many ways to Moore County. Ralph does *pro bono* legal work for non-profits, while Vivian lectures about the artist and their friend, Marc Chagall. In addition to philanthropy benefitting music and art, the Jacobson's have donated a collection of Hebraic and Judaic books which are circulated throughout the NC educational system.

Charles “Chuck” Stuber – Candidate for NC State Auditor



A former FBI Special Agent, hostage negotiator, member of a SWAT team, and State Board of Elections Chief Investigator, Chuck Stuber is uniquely qualified for the position of State Auditor. Educated as both an accountant and an attorney, Chuck has the experience needed to expose and uncover fraud, waste, abuse, and corruption. A graduate of N.C. State University and UNC Law School, after passing the NC bar exam, Chuck graduated from the FBI Academy. Stuber was involved in many high-profile, white-collar crime and corruption cases resulting in the prosecution of prominent office holders, including U.S. Senator and Presidential candidate John Edwards, former NC Governor Mike Easley, and Speaker of the House Jim Black, to name a few.

When asked why he wants to run for State Auditor, he explains that his whole career has been one of service to the citizens of our country and more recently, to the people of North Carolina. He has a passion for public service and making sure our government is able to do its best for its citizens as laid out in our Federal and State Constitutions.

President’s Message Kay Wildt

It turned out to be a tough month for those who would oppose the freedoms granted us in the Constitution. I thank all our members and friends who came out for Dr. Warner’s speech or expressed their support in other ways. It was a foregone conclusion that exposing the TRUTH would cause a reaction, but who could have imagined that a speaker would ignite such a firestorm of rabid opposition? And the real pity is that those opponents who called me had never heard Dr. Warner speak.
