Tucker Carlson to Speak at UNC School of Media and Journalism

Tucker Carlson, veteran political commentator with stints at CNN, PBS, MSNBC and FOX News, will give the 2018 Roy H. Park Distinguished Lecture for the UNC School of Media and Journalism on Thursday, April 12, at Memorial Hall. The public event will begin at 11 a.m.

Student newspaper says he is 'not a journalist'

Fox News host Tucker Carlson is scheduled to visit University of North Carolina's School of Media and Journalism to deliver the annual Roy H. Park Distinguished Lecture on April 12. In accepting the invitation, Carlson follows a long line of fair and balanced journalists who have delivered the lecture, including Chris Wallace, Brit Hume, and Charles Krauthammer.

While many students would welcome the opportunity to learn from an award-winning journalist, Carlson's lecture has drawn the ire of a number of students, and prompted the *Daily Tar Heel*, the official school newspaper of UNC-Chapel Hill, to publish an editorial titled, "Tucker Carlson is not a journalist."

The basis for the editorial, which fails to cite a single example of bad journalism by Carlson, is a response to a slew of negative Twitter responses from students and alumni regarding the announcement of the event.

Following the announcement of his lecture, a number of students and individuals took to Twitter to accuse UNC of bringing "a racist" with "no true journalistic principles," as well as multiple accusations that the school was now being operated by the Koch Brothers.

The Roy H. Park Distinguished Lecture Series has also featured a number of liberal speakers in the past, including former Clinton adviser George Stephanopoulos and the late Helen Thomas.

As a magazine and newspaper journalist, he has been a columnist for *New York Magazine* and *Reader's Digest*. He has also written for *Esquire*, *The Weekly Standard*, *The New Republic*, *The New York Times Magazine*, and *The Daily Beast*.

SC Gun Manufacturer Goes on Record

Palmetto State Armory also strongly supports the First Amendment which enables individuals to voice their opinions, even those in contrast with our own. We believe that a primary purpose of the Second Amendment is actually to protect the First Amendment.

In regards to the actions taken recently by the CEO of Dick's Sporting Goods to no longer sell the AR-15 platform, while we do not agree with this decision, we recognize the fact that capitalism gives him the right to make this call.

We do however have an issue with calling the AR-15 an "assault rifle." AR stands for ArmaLite Rifle which pays homage to the company that originally created the platform.

To blame the rifle or a high capacity magazine for the actions of an evil man is illogical and is only applied when referring to firearms.

Senseless acts of violence are a terrible plague on society that we all recognize we need to try and prevent as a community, but to blame a tool such as a firearm is at very best missing the point of the problem.

It is our hope that we can approach this negativity with humanity and both sides of the argument can come together and have a civil and intellectual conversation that continue to make this amazing county better. Tom McInnis - NC Senate - District 25

The son of a farmer and a teacher, McInnis grew up in a modest, working-class family on a farm in Richmond County where he learned the value of hard work and the importance of education. He put himself through school and built successful small businesses that have created jobs in local communities for years.

Tom has donated much time to community service through benefit auctions for charities and non-profits throughout the US raising millions of dollars to support worthy causes such as Habitat for Humanity, hospice, health related organizations, schools, wildlife conservation, and more.

Currently in his second term of the State Senate, he has worked to reduce unnecessary government regulations that stifle the entrepreneurial spirit. Since moving back to Aberdeen, I have been involved in local government, first on the Town's Planning Board and then as an elected Commissioner.

Currently serving his fifth term, Rep. Boles serves as Deputy Majority Whip. A lifelong resident of Moore County Rep. Boles attended Moore County Schools and is a graduate of Pinecrest High School. He received his Associate's degree in 1981 from Sandhills Community College in Business Administration and continued on to pursue his Funeral Service Degree in 1982 from the Cincinnati College of Mortuary Science in Ohio.

He began working in the funeral business upon his graduation from high school, continued that work throughout college and purchased his first funeral home shortly thereafter in 1984.

Sheriff Neil Godfrey - Sheriff

Neil Godfrey began his career in law enforcement as a Special Agent with the North Carolina State Bureau of Investigation in August, 1973.

Godfrey retired from the SBI in May, 2002. As an agent, he worked numerous criminal and drug investigations in eastern North Carolina. He last served the SBI as the Special Agent in Charge of the SBI Southeastern District where he supervised 27 agents.

He was appointed as Chief Deputy with the Moore County Sheriff's Office in December, 2002. His duties as Chief Deputy included filling in for the Sheriff in the Sheriff's absence, supervising the operation of the Sheriff's Office and the Detention Center and managing the budget for the Sheriff's Office and the Detention Center.

Sheriff Godfrey has been the Sheriff of Moore County since May 1, 2013. He is an active member of the North Carolina Sheriffs' Association where he serves on the legislative and training committees.

Godfrey graduated with a bachelor's degree in chemistry from Wake Forest University in May, 1973. He completed the N.C. State Bureau of Investigation Academy for Special Agents in November, 1973.

He is a graduate of Law Enforcement Executive Program sponsored by N.C. State University and is a Certified Public Manager. He has been awarded the Advanced Law Enforcement Certificate from N.C. Justice Training and Standards and the Order of the Long Leaf Pine.

Godfrey and his wife, Linda, live in Whispering Pines. They will be celebrating their 40th wedding anniversary in April. They have two sons, Brian and Brent. Brian and his wife, Hannah, are expecting their first child in May.

Outrage after California HS magazine cartoons depict Trump as Nazi, police as KKK members

FOX LA - Police and parents in California were reportedly outraged after students at a high school magazine published cartoons depicting President Donald Trump as a Nazi and an officer wearing KKK garb while aiming a gun at a black child.

"The Pawprint," a student publication at the prestigious Bonita High in LaVerne, featured two provocative cartoons that were apparently pulled from Google Images, Fox Los Angeles reported.

One drawing shows a swastika hiding underneath Trump's hair. Another portrays a uniformed police officer in a white hood pointing a pistol at a baby-faced black child holding a bag of skittles, in an apparent reference to Trayvon Martin – the teen who bought the candy before being shot by George Zimmerman in 2012.

Harvard Law offering class on Trump 'impeachment and removal'

Harvard Law School is currently offering a class dedicated to the "impeachment and removal by other means" of President Trump.
