## State election board fights federal subpoena of voting records

In a rare show of unity, the state elections board unanimously agreed during a Sept. 7 teleconference to challenge federal subpoenas of millions of voter records.

The board said state law barred it from sharing information from individual voters to the extent requested in the subpoenas. The office of U.S. Attorney Robert Higdon hasn't said why it wants the records, but an election attorney who's prosecuted voter fraud cases said the request is related to recent arrests of illegal immigrants who voted in North Carolina.

## Feds Made \$125 Billion in 'Improper Payments' in 2010--Enough To Fund State Department 11 Times Over

At a time of growing concern about government spending, the federal government made \$125 billion in "improper payments" in fiscal 2010, more than eleven times the total 2010 spending by the U.S State Department.

The \$125 billion in improper payments was also more than 7 times the total spending by the Justice Department or by NASA, which runs the U.S. space program, which is preparing to launch its last-ever shuttle flights.

Federal agencies reported improper payments estimated at \$125.4 billion in fiscal year 2010, an increase of \$16.2 billion from the \$109.2 billion estimate in fiscal 2009, the Government Accountability Office said.

One of the ordinances includes the agreements between the foundation and the city, which includes the foundation paying the city \$10 for the 99-year pact; the other ordinance clears the legal way to plow under Cornell Drive from 59th Street to Hayes Drive to be reconfigured as green space on the Obama campus. The closing of Cornell has been controversial.

## Member Spotlight

## Meet Irene Sauter

Oberframmern, Germany in 1934: Irene Sauter was just a baby when Nazis threatened to burn down her house in the town outside of Munich.

They were in town because the village refused to fly the “Swastika” flag, flying Bavarian flags instead. When the Nazis knocked on her door to tell her family to change flags, her mother refused to open it, leading to the threat of fire.

Hitler had previously ruled that private citizens were not allowed to keep guns, so there was no way to defend themselves. Luckily, the county’s riot police were called and got there just in time to make the Nazis leave.

Four years later, Irene went by bus into Munich with her mother to do some early Christmas shopping at the beautiful department stores (most of which were owned by Jews) – and was astonished to see glass and debris littering the streets.

Her mother had the gumption to go up to a Brown Shirt guard and demand to know what happened – but she was told to just “move along.” Irene was only about 5, but she remembers Kristallnacht.

And Irene’s uncle, a Catholic priest, was put in Nazi concentration camps twice for helping Jews who wanted to leave the country. Luckily, her family was able to bribe bureaucrats both times to let him out. “He looked like a ghost when he came to visit us,” she recalls.

After the war in 1950, Irene was interested in going into fashion design and was offered the opportunity to go to Paris to intern at a fashion house.

Her parents did not like that idea, so when her aunt invited her to visit her family who lived in New Jersey, Irene jumped at the idea.

That’s where she met John Sauter, her much-older cousin. They fell in love and were married – a union that lasted 62 years until his death at age 101 a few years ago.

“We both loved to travel and were very independent people,” says Irene. They especially liked the American West, but when it came time to retire, they chose Pinehurst because of all the amenities and proximity to the hospital, as John was dealing with health issues.

Asked to provide insights into today’s political environment, Irene recalls her youth in Nazi Germany and says, “Stick to the Constitution. Each person must take responsibility for themselves and don’t count on government to take care of you.

And beware of all the ism’s – communism, Fascism and Socialism. They promise the world but are nothing but bullies looking for total control.”
