On Sept. 18, Trump announced that only 30,000 refugees will be brought in to the U.S. This is a record low for the past 12 years and good news for many reasons, not a "xenophobic" agenda as many left-wing BuzzFeed bloggers would have you believe.

Islamists coming into the country at high rates have consistently voiced their opinion on the oppression of women, making rape legal and the freedom threatening ideology that Shariah Law should be federally enforced.

Fifty one percent of Muslims in America alone would like to see a Shariah court system (Center For Security Policy, 2015). County to challenge ruling concerning Pinebluff ETJ

At Tuesday's Moore County Board of Commissioners meeting, the board authorized an appeal to a recent court ruling favoring Pinebluff in a dispute concerning Pinebluff's extrajurisdictional zoning jurisdiction (ETJ).

In early October, the N.C. Court of Appeals ruled 3-0 that the Commissioners did not have the authority to block Pinebluff from extending its zoning authority 2 miles beyond the town limits. Under current state law, towns with a population over 10,000 can extend their zoning authority up to 2 miles outside their borders.

Towns like Pinebluff, with a population under 10,000, can automatically extend their authority up to 1 mile. The case centers around a 1999 law which Pinebluff believes grants it the authority for the 2 mile limit, regardless of whether the county is already zoned in the area.

The board voted 4-1 to pursue an appeal to the North Carolina Supreme Court. Dissenting was District IV, Commissioner Frank Quis who stated, "In my municipal experience, a 3-0 Court of appeals ruling is a very difficult hurdle to overcome."

BLASEY FORD NOMINATED FOR UNC'S DISTINGUISHED ALUMNA AWARD

Dr. Christine Blasey Ford has been nominated for University of North Carolina's distinguished alumna award after publicly coming forward with allegations of sexual misconduct against Supreme Court Justice Brett Kavanaugh.

Jennifer Ho, a professor in the Department of English and Comparative Literature, nominated Ford.

CBS 17, the local affiliate, published the letter in its entirety.

The letter read in part, "What Dr. Blasey Ford did on September 27, 2018 was something that was extraordinary in how ordinary it was: she told the truth about a sexual assault she experienced when she was fifteen years old at the hands of Judge Brett Kavanaugh. She made a statement and then answered questions for over three hours in front of a Senate Judiciary Committee with the cameras of the world trained on her."
